The Award for Outstanding Teachers who Change Students' Lives

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# Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn

A teacher, educator and development advocate, Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn has been working in the area of educational development for more than forty years since 1980. When HRH was young, HRH had an opportunity to accompany HRH's parents, His Majesty King Bhumibol Adulyadej, the Late King Rama IX and Queen Sirikit, to the rural areas of the provinces around Thailand for developmental work. Experiencing first-hand how the children and villagers in the remote areas live, HRH decided to concentrate her work on educational development. HRH recognizes that educational development comprises not only the promotion of teaching, learning and school construction; but also, working on health issues, skills development, and agriculture for food security. HRH believes that education is the foundation which enables people to lead their lives, provide for their families and contribute to the society. HRH's development projects, which started more than forty years ago in Thailand, have now expanded to many countries around the World.

As a result, HRH's work has been widely recognized both at the national and international levels. In 2005, UNESCO conferred the title of UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador for the "Empowerment of Minority Children through Education and through the Preservation of their Intangible Cultural Heritage" upon HRH. In 2018, UNICEF presented the "Life-Time Achievement Award" to HRH for HRH's significant contributions for improving the lives of children in Thailand, especially the most disadvantaged.

HRH has a passion for teaching. "*I want to be a teacher.*", was an answer HRH gave during the university admission interview for the Faculty of Arts, Chulalongkorn University. With this passion, HRH has been a teacher of History and Sociology at Chulachomklao Royal Military Academy since 1980. In addition, HRH has been a guest lecturer at several universities in Thailand. HRH recognizes that teacher is an important key success factor to students' achievement and quality education system. Thus, HRH has initiated several projects to build capacity for teachers in both pre-service and in-service programmes.

In recognition of HRH's contribution, devotion and commitment to teachers and education, the Princess Maha Chakri Award was established on the occasion of HRH's 60<sup>th</sup> Birthday Anniversary Celebration in 2015. The Award is given every two years to outstanding teachers from eleven Southeast Asian Countries (ASEAN + Timor-Leste) who change students' lives and make significant impacts to the community development. The Award serves as a means which enables these outstanding teachers to help other teachers and students in the Southeast Asian region.

# The Princess Maha Chakri Award

The Princess Maha Chakri Award is an award given every two years to outstanding teachers from eleven countries in Southeast Asia: Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Timor-Leste, and Thailand, who change students' lives and have made significant impacts on education and human resource development in their respective countries.



# The Nomination Process

The Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation provides the general criteria to the Ministries of Education of the eleven countries and each respective Ministry of Education sets up their own detailed criteria for selection. After extensive selection process, each Ministry of Education submits their nomination to the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation. The Foundation then presents the nominations to Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn for endorsement during an Annual Meeting. Once the nominations are endorsed, the Princess Maha Chakri Award Committee Members organize the Award Ceremony so that the eleven PMCA Recipients will be presented the PMCA Awards from Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn in Bangkok, Thailand. He started to gain more confidence and worked hard to improve his reading.

Since then, he has transformed from a boy who had difficulty reading to a boy who loves to read. His mother would buy him books as presents on every special occasion. The experiences inspire him to become a teacher so that he can help children learn to read, giving them opportunity and access to knowledge and books.

Mr. Irwan teaches “life,” not subjects. He believes that “every child matters.” Equity is important. He said he wants to be the access for all of his students to the world, especially underprivileged students. He feels that it is his duty as an adult to shape and inculcate the children of Brunei. Moreover, he wants to unleash the students so that they can reach their maximum potential. He thinks that there are two things in life that are necessary for one’s needs: education and manners. Thus, he commits himself as a teacher to preparing his students, the new generation of Brunei Darussalam, with these two essentials.

He initiates new teaching techniques to teach literacy and the English language to his students and trains other teachers in the method so that it can serve as a basic principle in teaching any subject. His methods include the English narrative writing strategy of six-picture composition and colorful semantics. 

Mdm Chong Chew Luan Penny is a teacher for visually impaired (VI) students, and she strongly believes in inclusive education. She has dedicated 15 years of excellent service to nurturing VI students in Ahmad Ibrahim Secondary School (AISS), which has 7 students that are VI and need additional support. Mdm Chong has been a dedicated resource teacher for all subjects that her VI students undertake. This duty also includes converting academic materials into Braille, developing additional materials, or embarking on adhoc projects like learning an online tool for music composition to assist a student how to use it for his music examination at O-level. She also leads the other VI resource teachers in providing the best coaching programme for the VI students in the school.

Mdm Chong played an instrumental role in the holistic development of VI students through the implementation of various initiatives. For instance, she initiated a collaboration between the school and National University of Singapore's College of Alice and Peter Tan since 2018 to reinforce the school's 2-level approach to the VI programme, whereby VI students learn daily living skills to gain greater independence and our sighted students learn to help and care for the VI.

While working on her students' academic progress, Mdm Chong is also conscious about promoting inclusion in and outside of school. Therefore, she creates opportunities for VI students to interact with sighted students and getting them involved in activities externally, where they work with mentors to pursue their interests or showcase their talents. For instance, since 2014, Penny has liaised with Ngee Ann Polytechnic (NP) and coordinated with the Assistant Year-Head and Form Teachers to organise the annual Dialogue-in-the-Dark Learning Journey in NP which aims to provide first-hand experience of the challenges which VI persons face in their daily lives.

Mr. Niwat is a karen sagaw who was born in a village named Ban Ramad in Ta Song Yang district, high up in the mountains of Tak province. He never thought that he would one day become a teacher. After he graduated with his bachelor degree in agriculture and plant science from Rajamangala University of Technology in Nan province, he got a job in a water project with Bhumibol Dam in Tak province. In 2001, he returned to his home town in Ta Song Yang district in Tak province to take care of his father.

After coming back home, he applied for a position at Mae Fah Luang Community Learning Center in Baan Huay Pra Chao (บ้านห้วยพระเจ้า) in Tak province. He fell in love with his role in the community when he learned that he had helped change two men’s lives. These two men were opium addicts. They quit opium and had a decent job because of the project that Mr. Niwat engaged and worked with them.

At first, Mr. Niwat did not have any background working with the community. At Mae Fah Luang Community Learning Center in Baan Huay Pra Chao (บ้านห้วยพระเจ้า), Mr. Niwat started learning how to organize community participation, how to communicate with the villagers, working with them to identify community problems and finding solutions together with them.

He later moved to Mae Fah Luang Community Learning Center in Ban Mokokhi (บ้านมอโก๊ะคี) in the same province. Once he moved to Ban Mokokhi, he applied his experiences and created partnerships with the community network, such as provincial health services, universities, and social welfare workers, to provide knowledge to the community and give them resources. He makes use of the network and strengthens the connection. As a result, with the support of the partnership, he was able to build over 10 community learning centers. He had to walk for more than a day from one community learning center to another to help and monitor these centers. He genuinely wants to improve the quality of life for the villagers by providing them knowledge and education.

Mr. Niwat helps and leads the community to find solutions to health issues such as dengue fever, opium drug addiction, and literacy. He helps the community through the learning process. He builds trust in them with his honesty and strategizes through relevant issues/community problems. With young children, Mr. Niwat helps them learn how to read and write Thai so that they can function in Thai society and gain knowledge for higher-level education and for their own living. With the community, Mr. Niwat uses strategies such as town hall meetings, community radio broadcasts, capacity building, and constantly monitoring progress.

He sets himself up as a role model of honesty and a hard-working person. He also uses social media to promote his community. He encourages them to grow coffee instead of opium. After over 20 years of convincing, no opium is grown in that area.

He strongly believes that a person must pay back their motherland, Thailand. When he was young, he saw Keren from Myanmar escape domestic war from Myanmar to Thailand, so he feels very lucky and fortunate to have been born in Thailand, a peaceful country with a lot of resources. He said with conviction that he owes it to his motherland, Thailand. Thus, he will continue to contribute wholeheartedly to pay it back by helping others.

Mr. Nguyen is currently a vice principal at Hoang Van Thu Gifted High School in Hoa Binh Province, a school for talented children from various ethnic minority groups in Vietnam. Being a teacher was Mr. Nguyen's childhood dream. After graduating from Hoa Binh University, he fulfilled his dream and started teaching at Hoa Binh Provincial Ethnic Minority Boarding School until August 2022.

Besides being a school administrator, Mr. Nguyen teaches geography. He received a Master of Natural Geography. With his passion for geography, he inspires and ignites the love for learning geography in his students. He led his students to join various competitions, both at the provincial and national levels. Throughout his 27 years of teaching geography, his students won 18 provincial prizes, three of which won national prizes in 2022.

He is not only passionate about geography but also compassionate toward his students. As the students in his school are from ethnic minorities, they often misbehave. Mr. Nguyen cares about them and shows them love, understanding, and support. To help them, he patiently investigated the reasons behind their misbehavior. He understands that misbehaving students have reasons rooted in themselves, their families, their friends, or others. Their misbehavior is often due to a lack of problem-solving skills and an inability to deal with conflicts. When shown love, understanding, and support, they will gradually transform into well-behaved students. He developed an online system to manage students' leave applications at Hoa Binh Provincial Ethnic Boarding High School. In 2022, this online system won the Consolation Prize at "The 8<sup>th</sup> Technical Innovation in Hoa Binh Province Contest" and has become a provincial model that schools use throughout the province. His ingenuity has changed students' awareness, attitudes, and behaviors. As a result, Mr. Nguyen was able to prevent problems that may arise in the boarding environment.

As a school administrator, Mr. Nguyen serves as a youth union official. He initiated a life skills education model for high school students in boarding school called "30 golden minutes". This initiative was awarded by the Central Committee of the Ho Chi Minh Communist Youth Union as one of the models that is now used nationwide.

He is also very active in community work. He organizes many cultural exchanges and volunteer groups in the mountainous areas to raise funds for the disabled, the disadvantaged, and patients with fatal diseases. ## Criteria for the Selection of the 2023 Princess Maha Chakri Award Recipients

To commemorate the auspicious occasion of Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn's 60<sup>th</sup> birthday anniversary in 2015, the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation and the Teachers' Council of Thailand recognize the outstanding teachers whose dedication and achievements have resulted in significant impact on the students' lives and a better education system.

The Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation, in association with eleven Ministries of Education from all ASEAN countries and Timor-Leste to each search and nominate an exceptional teacher worthy of the prestigious Princess Maha Chakri Award in the year 2023 according to the selection guidelines stipulated by the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation. The Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation provides the overall criteria which is "Teachers who Changes Students' Lives", particularly the disadvantaged groups. The following are four principles:

- 1. Consolidation of national mechanisms that promote and honour outstanding teachers.** The selection processes should mobilize and augment existing mechanisms to foster understanding of the general public and acceptance that the awardees are justifiably commendable of such honor.
- 2. Participation from all sectors of society.** This is to enhance widespread public appreciation of the pivotal value of teachers and impact on student development through extensive participation in transparent selection processes and other contributions.
- 3. Promotion campaigns at all levels of society.** Nomination of teachers from all levels should be encouraged, e.g. communities, selection by area-based mechanisms, government agencies, professional organizations. This would enable promotion of local and nationwide campaigns as well as public awareness and participation to ensure transparency of the selection process.
- 4. Evidence of developmental changes to students and inspiration to fellow teachers.** Empirical evidence on changes and inspiration that are direct results of endeavors of the Award recipients should be sought and highlighted. The Ministry of Education of each member country sets up their own processes and criteria as follows:

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

A selection of a recipient from Brunei Darussalam has carried out by the Education's Executive Selection Committee for the 5<sup>th</sup> Princess Maha Chakri Award 2023.

1. The selection started with the identification of eligible candidates that are among teachers/instructors or leaders of educational institutions who have received the 'Excellent Teacher Award' in conjunction with the Teacher's Day Celebration, Brunei Darussalam held in the last five (5) years [2018-2022's recipient]. They also

- i. still actively involved in teaching and working either in government or private education institutions,
- ii. maintaining excellence in the field of education/service within the last five (5) years,
- iii. have served not less than 20 years and have at least 15 years of teaching experience, and
- iv. have a remaining of service not less than 10 years.

2. The selection of the top candidates is based on the evaluation result of all criteria in the following aspects:

- i. Quality of Teaching and Management
- ii. Administration and Management of Schools / Institutions / Department / Units
- iii. Professional Development
- iv. Leadership Teaching / Education
- v. Contribution
- vi. Personality / Discipline / Ethical Standards
- vii. Awards
- viii. Other Traits - include the following

National contribution in various forms including providing advisory, professional and research services, writing and publication for the development of education and society in Brunei Darussalam

a) Being actively involved in professional/educational organizations or bodies, welfare activities or in voluntary, community and/or religious work is an advantage.

b) Have excellent and commendable service record in schools / educational institutions, offices or society and clean from security filters any criminal cases.

c) Provide positive impact to improve the quality of life of the people especially the underprivileged.

d) Respect for the dedicated teachers from eleven (11) countries in Southeast Asia who have contributed to the development of education and human development. This includes contributions in education and the advancement of teaching by attending and presenting papers, sharing knowledge and skills in conferences, seminars, forums, and workshops at the national and international levels.

e) Supporting and promoting the profession of education. This includes being able to attract interest/trust of students/community towards the profession of education; and capacity as supervisor, operator, facilitator in educational programmes/activities.

f) Strengthen international relations in the field of education. This includes the following:

- Contribute to education and teacher progress by attending or presenting papers, sharing knowledge and skills in conferences, seminars, forums and workshops or being facilitators, mentors, consultants or referees in educational development and human development activities at the international level;
- Involvement or membership in professional activities of educational development and human development (including competition and exhibition activities) at the international level;
- Receive certificates/letters/badges of appreciation or recognition, and other awards and successes for professional involvement including guidance for competition activities or research or the sharing of knowledge and skills of students international.

The last process are

1. The result of the final selection and the name of the nominated recipient is sent for validation by the Permanent Secretary (Core) Education and the Minister of Education.

2. Minister's Official Letter to His Majesty The Sultan of Brunei Darussalam to get His Majesty's validation, approval, and consent.

3. The name of the nominated recipient is sent to PMCAF upon receiving consent from His Majesty The Sultan of Brunei Darussalam.

Established by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport of the Kingdom of Cambodia, the nominees for selection shall score high in these criteria in the following core indicators:

- Profile and experience of teaching of at least 5 years;
- Having analytical skills and information explanation;
- Preparation and conduct of demonstration teaching class.

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

The selection process for the Princess Maha Chakri Award recipients in Lao PDR was conducted at four levels, namely school, district, provincial and central levels.

1. The Department of Organization and Personnel, Ministry of Education and Sports, sent a memo to inform 18 Provincial Education and Sports Services.
2. Each level appointed their respective selection committee.
3. Each of the 18 provincial committees selected their best teachers and sent the reports of outstanding performance of 18 best teachers to the Ministry of Education and Sports.
4. The Ministry Committee conducted three meetings:
  - Shortlisted 5 candidates from the 18 candidates of best teachers (2 from primary, 1 from secondary school, 1 from lower secondary school, and 1 from upper secondary school),
  - Selected only one candidate who is the best as the Lao representative to receive the Princess Maha Chakri Award 2023
  - Announced and endorsed the recipient among the Selection Committee and all departments at Ministry of Education and Sports.
5. The Department of Organization and Personnel submitted a report and the nomination of the best teacher to the Minister of Education and Sports.
6. The Minister of Education and Sports approved the nomination.

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

1. Nomination is made by the 16 State Education Departments (SED) and respective divisions in the Ministry of Education (MoE), Malaysia.

2. The Deputy Director General of Education (Teacher Professionalism Development Sector) is the Focal Person for the PMCA Award in Malaysia. He heads the PMCA Nomination Committee. The Committee consists of Strategic Planning and International Relations Division, the School Inspectorate Division and the Education Resources and Technology Division.

3. A taskforce has been set up to shortlist candidates and evaluation including online interview by evaluation panels followed by an on-site evaluation of the shortlisted candidates.

4. The candidates were evaluated based on:

a. Online interview (40%):

- Professional
- Contributions
- Implemented programs
- Impact on students and community
- Personality
- Educational background and services;
- Human Capital Development Programmes;
- Teachers' Association, Awards.

b. Onsite interview (60%):

- Teaching and learning
- Presentation by Candidate;
- Outcome on Human Capital Development;
- Interview with candidate, Head of Department, colleagues and Students
- Innovations
- Wow factors

5. The outcome of the both evaluations were presented to the PMCA Nomination Committee and is endorsed by the Secretary General of Ministry of Education, Malaysia.

## SELECTION PROCESS

1. Teachers from (49) Basic Education Schools in Myanmar which have been implementing PMCA programme were asked to apply for 2023 PMCA Award.

2. Those teachers were asked to participate in an in-person interview. During the interview, they were asked to demonstrate their English language skills, their computer skill, their knowledge about ASEAN and PMCA, and elaborate on the school activities they have participated in.

3. The first three teachers who have got the highest marks in the interview were proposed by the Department of Basic Education. They were selected and approved by the Ministry of Education.

# THE PHILIPPINES

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

### **The Philippines, Princess Maha Chakri Award Screening Committee Criteria:**

- a. Participation in community and civic movements most especially where education is least accessible;
- b. Innovation in teaching has benefited in communities where he/she has taught;
- c. Ability to inspire, promote, and sustain the development of students and fellow teachers through their decision.

### **The Philippines, PMCA's screening process shall undergo the following procedure:**

- a. PMCA Selection Committee composed of Deputy Minister (Undersecretary), the Head of Bureau of Human Resources and Organization Development (BHRD), Head of the International Cooperation Office (ICO), Head of the National Educators' Academy of the Philippines (NEAP);
- b. One (1) nominee from each region of the Philippines to be submitted to DepEd Central Office;
- c. PMCA Selection Committee meeting convened to deliberate on the seventeen (17) nominations and select one (1) awardee;
- d. The Minister of Education, Philippines approves the awardee chosen;
- e. The one chosen will be submitted to the PMCA Foundation for further review.

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

1. Singapore’s Princess Maha Chakri Award (PMCA) selection rides on our President’s Award for Teachers (PAT) selection process. The call for PAT nominations begins in October of the preceding year and it ends in January of the year of the award. The selection process is between February and July.

2. In 2022, more than 11,000 nominations were received from 335 schools and institutions. The nominations come from school leaders, teachers, parents, as well as former and current students. Thereafter, the nominees would be endorsed by their respective school or institution principals, and only 17 candidates were shortlisted for the Selection Interview. The Selection Panel will also decide on Singapore’s nomination for the PMCA based on the pool of shortlisted candidates.

3. The Selection Panel for the Singapore’s 2023 PMCA nominee was chaired by Mr Patrick Tay, Chairman of Government Parliamentary Committee (GPC) (Education) and comprised the Permanent Secretary (Education), the Second Permanent Secretary (Education), Director-General of Education, a former Principal of a Post-Secondary Education Institution and two COMPASS (COMMunity and PARENTs in Support of Schools) members.

4. The Selection Panel identified Mdm Chong Chew Luan Penny as Singapore’s nominee for the 2023 PMCA, and the table below provides a summary of key information on Mdm Chong who is visually handicapped, but she is independent and has been giving presentations to our local teachers. She is capable of travelling beyond Singapore as long as there is a caregiver traveling with her.

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

### GENERAL CRITERIA

1. Must be Thai nationality and living in Thailand.
2. Is or was a teacher of basic education in public or private schools.
3. Is or has been a teacher who teaches basic education level, particularly the disadvantaged students in the remote areas.
4. Has been teaching and involves in learning management continuously for at least 15 years as of the date of announcement.
5. Is not a person who makes a career of being a part-time teacher.

### SPECIFIC CRITERIA

1. Is the teacher who has made significant impact to the student's lives and uplifts the teaching profession and dedicates to fulfill mission of teaching toward student's success.
2. Is a teacher who contributes to education and is a role model to other teachers. Has been teaching or involves in learning management. Has significant development to education in the country and the region.

### ELIGIBLE NOMINATOR

1. Public and Private organizations according to the announcement of the PMCA Foundation.
2. Basic education institutions with the approval of the Office of the Basic Education Commission (one institution per one candidate and submit the nomination to the Provincial Selection Committee)
3. Associations, Foundations and Organizations whose mission is to promote learning (one organization per one candidate and submit the nomination to the Provincial Selection Committee).
4. Alumni-age not less than 25 years old (one student per one candidate and submit the nomination to the Provincial Selection Committee).
5. Teachers at the higher education level who used to teach the candidate (three teachers at higher education level per one candidate and submit the nomination to the Provincial Selection Committee).

## **SELECTION PROCESS**

The Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation Committee sets up the Committees for selection process. In this regard, there are a number of Committees and Sub-committees with the following procedures:

### **1. Provincial Selection Committee**

Firstly, the selection process commences at the provincial level.

- The Governor of each province appoints the Provincial Selection Committee comprising members from various agencies concerned.
- The number of nominated teachers are considered in proportion to the population in each province.
- Public hearing will be organized in case that there is an objection to the shortlisted candidates.
- The Provincial Selection Committee then submits the nomination to the Central Selection Committee.

### **2. The Central Selection Committee**

The Central Committee comprises three Sub-committees.

2.1 The members of the first Sub-committee comprising representatives from the public, private and media sectors jointly screen the nomination documents and select 40 candidates from 176 candidates based on detailed information from the Provincial Selection Committee.

2.2 The members of the second Sub-committee study an in-depth review and select 20 candidates from 40 candidates.

2.3 The members of the third Sub-committee go to observe the shortlisted candidates at the school sites as appropriate.

### **3. Observations/Evaluation**

The members of the Selection Sub-committee that go to the school sites have to observe and interview all concerned such as students (alumni and current students), fellow teachers, school principals, parents and community members. Then the members of the Sub-committee select three most outstanding teachers from 20 candidates and submit the nomination to the Central Selection Committee and the Academic Committee for endorsement. Only one candidate is awarded the PMCA teacher, the other two teachers receive Kunakorn Awards and the 17 remaining teachers are awarded Yingkhun Teachers whereas the rest candidates are awarded Kwan Sit Teachers. Lastly, the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation Committee calls its meeting to approve the nominations as proposed.

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

### SELECTION PROCESS:

The MoE was submitting the proper document to all teachers across the country through Municipal Director to socialize the manuals which prepare from Ministry of Education team. The aims are to encourage the teachers to applying individually base on their performance achievement.

From the 13 municipalities, the selection committee received 14 candidates. The nominees were required to meet the criteria as stated below:

- Permanent citizen of Timor-Leste
- Minimum age 30 years old
- 10 years of minimum service as a teacher (teaching experience)
- Demonstrate good skills in developing teaching materials
- Demonstrate him/her to be a positive role model to fellow teachers in the school and to the community in general
- Demonstrate good communication skills and effective interaction with fellow teachers, parents of students, and the community as education stakeholders.

Teachers recommended are truly adopting a child-centered and effective pedagogical approach, both during teaching time and/or during training.

1. School visits were conducted unexpectedly, in order to prevent the schools or the candidates preparing and/or organizing themselves in advance.

2. Interviews with teachers, other teacher colleagues, school coordinators, students and parents were conducted during the school visits.

3. Classroom observations were conducted during the school visits, with the aim of gathering a clear understanding of each candidate's teaching approach, ensuring that child-centered methodology was being used properly and prominently. Have proper initiative to invent some teaching content as learning tools which will use properly and also usefulness by other teachers and students over the sub municipalities as a model. Have innovative thinking to promote the class extracurricular with coordination with the school principals and school committee.

4. We selected five best teachers among the 14 candidates.

5. The Minister of Education selected the top from the five teachers.

## CRITERIA AND SELECTION PROCESS

### PROCESS CRITERIA

1. Being currently a teacher or educator or educational manager at secondary or high school.
2. Dedicated to education with outstanding achievements and contribution to education and human resource development of the city/province/school.
3. Deserving international recognition for his/her support and development of teaching professional and educational development, including wider international cooperation in the field of education.
4. Pro-active in teaching and/or administration of the school. (+ priority given to candidate who can speak English)

### SELECTION PROCESS

1. Upon receipt of the invitation letter from the Princes Maha Chakri Award Foundation in 2022, the International Cooperation Department of Ministry of Education and Training (MOET) reported to MOET Leader for guidance.
2. The Department of Emulation – Reward (now the Department of Personnel and Organization) has selected the best candidate from the list of excellent teachers in 2023 from 63 Provinces/cities in Vietnam: Mr. Nguyen Manh Hung, Vice Principal of Hoang Van Thu High School for the Gifted for the 5<sup>th</sup> Princess Maha Chakri Award.
3. MOET Leaders have approved the nomination.
