#### The Princess Maha Chakri Award

The Princess Maha Chakri Award is established on the auspicious occasion to celebrate the 60th birthday anniversary of HRH Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn in 2015. Teachers eligible for the Princess Maha Chakri Award are teachers that the general public collectively acknowledges and acclaims their teaching career dedication with the recognized evidence of creating as well as nurturing development changes in the lives of their students. These changes are not only reflected upon the students but have also inspired other fellow teachers. Citizens at all levels will be integral to the search and selection processes for these exceptional teachers worthy of such notable honour.

The Princess Maha Chakri Award selection processes should adhere to the following four approaches:

1. Consolidation of national mechanisms that promote and honour outstanding teachers. The selection processes should mobilize and augment existing mechanisms to foster understanding of the general public and acceptance that the awardees are justifiably commendable of such celebrated honour.

- **2. Participation from all sectors of society.** This is to enhance widespread public appreciation of the pivotal value of teachers and impact on student development through extensive participation in transparent selection processes and other contributions.
- **3. Promotion campaigns at all levels of society.** Nomination of teachers from all levels should be encouraged, e.g. communities, selection by area-based mechanisms, government agencies, professional organizations. This would enable promotion of local and nationwide campaigns as well as public awareness and participation to ensure transparency of the selection process.
- **4. Evidence of developmental changes to students and inspiration to fellow teachers.** Empirical evidence on changes and inspiration that are direct results of endeavours of the Award recipients should be sought, highlighted and celebrated .

#### Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

Since I have received the Award, I have taken part in knowledge sharing sessions where I was able to introduce the Princess Maha Chakri Award and share best practice in teaching students with special education needs with Special Education Needs Assistant (SENA) teachers and the staff of Special Education Units in several districts throughout the country.

To enhance knowledge exchange, I have been on various study visits across Thailand in December 2016. This has included visiting Setsatian School for the Deaf in Bangkok, Kawila Anukul School (school for children with learning difficulties) and the Northern School for the Blind in Chiang Mai, all of which specialized in teaching children with different learning needs.

To observe strategies that can facilitate moving from segregation to inclusion, I have also visited a few inclusive schools; Phyathai School and Santirat Wittayalai Secondary School in Bangkok. I was able to learn from these mainstream schools as regards accommodating the learning needs of diverse groups of learners.

In terms of institution visits, I have visited the Ministry of Education (Bureau for Special Education Administration) and the Faculty of Education (Special Education), Suan Dusit University. These visits provided a good opportunity to share experience and exchange ideas whilst furthering my knowledge about the special education system in Thailand. Through these visits, collaboration in the field of special education between Brunei Darussalam and Thailand has been strengthened.



Following the study visits in Thailand, I disseminated the knowledge gained to teachers and staff of Keriam Primary School in Tutong District in March 2017. As changes often stem from altering mind-sets, I inspired teachers to open their minds to see the benefits of diversity in education, with a view to ensuring the right to quality education for all students, regardless of their diverse backgrounds and abilities. My aim was also to raise their awareness that an Early Intervention Programme is important in order to identify the most appropriate assistance for students and equip them with necessary skills through utilizing appropriate strategies and technologies.

#### **Future Plans**

I would like to further my knowledge by connecting with Thai institutions, such as Suan Dusit University, in order to learn how to design a suitable curriculum and early intervention programme for students with special educational needs. To maximise my learning experience, I would like to spend a significant amount of time to observe classes specializing in responding to students' special educational needs and have dialogue and discussions with experts in this area. I am also interested in joining seminars and conferences related to special education and visiting organizations that cater for children with different abilities, such as children with autism, Down's syndrome and hearing and visual impairments in Thailand in the future.

In addition, I would like to develop a proposal for special education needs teachers in Brunei to further their studies through the continuous professional development (CPD) programme on special education at the Faculty of Education, Suan Dusit University in Thailand.

#### Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

- 1. After receiving the Award, I have shared my experience with the school management committee and teachers in my school as well as teachers from other schools who came for a study visit at my school. I also gave presentations on ideas for effective teaching and learning based on the work and innovations of other PMCA recipients to Cambodian teachers throughout the country. In addition, I reported about my work and the PMCA to the Minister of Education, Youth and Sport.
- 2. The Ministry of Education, Youth and Sport has regarded me as a model teacher and provided me with an opportunity to represent women in education and share my journey to success from the first day of my teaching until the days I was awarded Somdech Hun Sen's Award and PMCA respectively.
- 3. I have ensured that my PMCA money was spent meaningfully. A certain amount was donated to support poor students for their education. Another amount was paid for learning materials for 100 students and planting 200 trees at Prek Por School in Varin District of Siem Reap Province.





- 4. As inadequate school infrastructure can be a barrier to students' access to and participation in learning, I developed a project proposal and received the support of Japan to construct a single-storey building to accommodate five classrooms and to build toilet facilities of 10 cubicles in Svay Leur District, Siem Reap Province.
- 5. Good teachers should be lifelong learners. I am committed to strengthening my own capabilities, particularly in foreign languages and using technology in education. As part of my learning journey, I studied basic Thai language for one week in Surin Province of Thailand, supported by Surin Rajabhat University. In addition, I undertook a study visit to several primary schools in Bangkok, Nakhon Nayok, and Sa Kaeo province, Thailand. Through this visit under the support of the PMCA Foundation, my colleagues and I aspire to gain new teaching methodologies.
- 6. I have created the Somdech Hun Sen Award's teacher network for teachers to exchange knowledge and experience, share teaching and learning materials, explore practical solutions for student's learning difficulties, and support each other in their teaching.
- 7. After receiving the Award, there have been positive changes in my personal life. I have become a role model for teachers in other schools. With



my strong commitment, I have worked harder and continued to thirst for knowledge on innovative teaching methods in order to teach more effectively. I have also encouraged and inspired other teachers to put more efforts in their teaching for the most benefits of students. Beyond the education sector, I have expanded my voluntary social work to help sustain the Children's Hospital in Siem Reap.

#### **Future Plans**

- I will continue sharing my experience with other teachers in the region through technology.
- I understand that students learn in different ways, at different paces, and as a teacher. Thus, I will continue to seek appropriate strategies and methods to support students, especially those with special educational needs.

- I will also motivate and encourage teachers to enhance their capacities in supporting those students who most need it towards success in their studies.
- I have planned to establish a teacher network in Cambodia where teachers can exchange their experience and collaborate with other teachers.
- I have planned to enter a national competition for Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn' scholarship to pursue my doctoral degree in education.

#### Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

Being chosen as a PMCA awardee has certainly afforded me more credibility and opportunity towards developing my skills and competencies as a teacher, especially with regards to the subject of science. PMCA has also indirectly made me a teacher model not only for other science teachers, but for other teachers in general. It will be easier for me to share knowledge and experience with other teachers.

After receiving the Princess Maha Chakri Award 2015, I have often received invitations to be a trainer for in-service teacher training on competence development and sharing my knowledge and experience with other teachers not only in my own city but also in other areas in my province as well as sharing my knowledge of a professional teacher development through online media with teachers in Indonesia.

Opportunities to improve my ability, knowledge, and skills in the teaching profession were increased after receiving the PMCA Award 2015, and afforded me even more passion and confidence in my work. #### **Future Plans**

 As Indonesia is a very big country, this creates challenges in the dissemination of learning innovations and knowledge sharing through seminars and workshops. I have accepted an invitation from the Indonesian Teachers Union (Ikatan Guru Indonesia) to disseminate knowledge and learning innovations with other teachers in every province in Indonesia once or twice a month on Saturdays and Sundays.

- I will create a video blog on my own YouTube channel about innovations in learning that can be used or adapted by teachers in Indonesia. This will be effective as teachers can access whenever and wherever they are, provided that they have an internet connection.
- In order to improve my teaching skills and creating an interesting, active
  and creative learning process in science, I will promote the applications of
  the STEM education model. STEM Education model is new to Indonesia,
  so it needs good planning and foresight to synchronize with the curriculum
  and syllabus for the science subject in Indonesia.
- I will improve the competence of students by providing an extracurricular
  activity 'Computer Science' using our computer labs. This will be a
  challenge for me because most of the students in my school do not have
  a computer in their home they will only be able to use computers in the
  school computer laboratory. I would like to teach students games and
  coding with simple software which will improve their creative and critical
  thinking skills.



## Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

- 1. To share my knowledge and experience after receiving the Princess Maha Chakri Award 2015, I gave a presentation on the Award and showed its video to all teachers in Vientiane High School. I donated some amount of the award money to the school to help fulfil its needs. In recognition of my achievement, the school presented me with a certificate of appreciation for my contribution to increasing the school's reputation. Beyond the school community, I presented about the Award to a number of high-level officials from different departments within the Ministry of Education and Sports (MoES).
- 2. Reaching out to a wider audience, I was interviewed by several local newspapers, radio and television programmes. My stories are featured as 'The Best Teacher in Asian' spotlighting the Princess Maha Chakri Award 2015 in People's Voice Newspaper and Economics Newspaper as well as in a national television programme called 'Good Work, Excellent People'.
- 3. My dedication to teaching has been recognised at international level. I received a Palme Academique medal from the Government of France, awarded to me by the French Ambassador to the Lao PDR in February 2016.
- 4. Although I have reached my retirement age, I have never stopped teaching and training. As requested by Vientiane High School, I have continued teaching both bilingual and general classes, and sometimes served as a substitute teacher for those on maternity leave. In my capacity as the school's Advisor for Teaching and Learning, I provide my technical support and guidance to both new and experienced teachers as well as students. Recently, I trained and supervised two teacher trainees during their teaching practice in the school. I am also a member of the school committee that provide remedial lessons for the students who have missed their classes or are lagging behind their peers. As parents also play an important role to support their child' education, the parents or guardians of those students also participated in the remedial classes. In addition, I assisted the school in preparing standardized and unified French examination papers for the end of academic year 2015-2016 to be taken in four provinces, namely Luangprabang, Savannakhet, Champasak, and Vientiane capital. I also led the students on a study tour to an organic laboratory run by the Ministry of Agriculture in February 2017. During the school break, I cooperated with the French Institution to provide a short course on French language targeting the students from the Institution of Law.

- 5. I have served a few coordinator roles. I liaise between the Embassy of France and the MoES to help ensure that Vientiane High school is regarded as one of the best schools within AEFE (Agence pour l'Enseignement Français à l'Etranger) the network for teaching French in foreign countries. Vientiane High School is the first school in Southeast Asia joining the network. I also coordinate with the Embassy of France and Namtheun 2 Company to bring Vientiane High School students to take part in a scholarship competition to study electrical courses. I was very proud of my students who won 3 out of 5 scholarships. To support marginalised students, I have continued seeking financial assistance for their education whenever possible. In November 2016, I met with members of the Association to Assist Asian Children to request their financial support for good students who come from a poor family.
- 6. At the same time, I have continued training French bilingual teachers. When I was invited to train French teachers in Pasatipatai School in Luangprabang, I took the opportunity to introduce the Princess Maha Chakri Award to the teachers and the school management team. Some amount of the funds from the Award was also used for organizing this training.
- 7. In addition, I have continued to share my knowledge and experience in various occasions. For instance, I provided my input during the gathering of teachers to cerebrate the 22nd anniversary of the National Teacher's Day in October 2016. In March 2017, I shared my views with teachers and parents on improving learning and teaching, and working together to help facilitate the student's learning as a preparation for the Francophonie festival. I have also been invited as a member of the committee that select the best students across the country to participate in the 'Questions and Answers for Science Subject in Bilingual Classes'. The event was organized by the Ministry of Education and Sports, with support of the International Organization of Francophonie.
- 8. Regarding my contributions in the field of French language, I provided advice to the organizing committee of French Speaking Competition during the Linguistics Week, and served as a judge for poem recitation and debates. I was also an advisor for the French group for their participation in the Science Week, and supported French teachers in preparing examination papers for Semester I and II for the French group. #### **Future Plans**

My enthusiasm and energy levels remain high after retirement. I wish to continue providing training on foreign languages teaching methodologies, especially French language, to other teachers. I have plans to organize different activities to promote French speaking skills and good reading habits in students. In my view, modern-day students do not pay much attention to reading, but rather to engaging in social media or playing games on their phone. As a result, they cannot read or understand foreign languages well. For this reason, I would like to request support from the Princess Maha Chakri Award Foundation to build a small library in Vientiane High School to allow students to practise reading and speaking foreign languages. This small library can also be used for different activities and training for teachers and students.





### Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

In addition to regular teaching, I implemented the following activities more effectively and efficiently in the academic year 2015/2016. I carried out school agriculture activity to support the school nutrition program. For the school health program, I carried out anthropometric measurements to assess the nutritional status of the children in order to provide suitable diets for malnourished students. I also shared nutritional knowledge with students and parents in order for students to have appropriate and adequate food in their diet. In addition, I participated in health education activities, vaccine injections such as chickenpox, vaccine distribution such as elephantiasis and distributing iron supplements.

In the school library, I encouraged students to develop reading habits and sharing knowledge from reading. I managed presentations about the articles they read in order to develop reading, speaking, listening and presentation skills. As part of a religious activity, I took part in offering Kathain robe to monks. I also donated two water tanks to my school to store sufficient clean drinking water.

In the academic year 2016/2017, I was granted a scholarship by the Office of Her Royal Highness Princess Maha Chakri Sirindhorn's Project (OPSP). I



am currently studying a Master of Science degree majoring in School Health at Mahidol University in Bangkok, Thailand. For this reason, I have very limited opportunities to participate in the special activities of my school at the moment.

#### **Future Plans**

In terms of my future action plans, I will extend the school health program to the greatest effect and apply the knowledge gained from my current studies. To do so, I will carry out several activities:

- 1. I will implement a school nutrition program based on three measurements. I will monitor the height and weight of students regularly and calculate their Body Mass Index (BMI) to assess their nutritional status. I will then provide necessary food to the students and share my knowledge about nutrition with their parents based on the results of their BMI.
- 2. I will carry out a personal hygiene activity. The importance of proper hand-washing technique, especially before meals and after visiting the toilet, will be emphasized and demonstrated, and students will be urged to practice it. Talks on hand-washing will be given to raise students' awareness that hands are a major vector of spreading diseases. I will also check up on students as to whether they have proper personal hygiene practice in their daily life.
- 3. I will extend the health checkup in my school to include eyes, teeth and ears. Currently at my school, teeth are checked up on twice a year by the township medical officers but not eyes and ears.



- 4. Regarding health education, I will focus on mental health, alcohol and drug use, sex education and the issue of addiction to mobile phones. I think this is essential education for adolescent students in secondary schools. I would like to help students who have social problems that could create negative impacts on their education. I will support them in a friendly and caring atmosphere by counselling and suggesting possible solutions for their social, emotional, health and educational problems.
- 5. The current lifestyle in Myanmar is changing to a sedentary lifestyle and most people spend most of their time with computers, mobile phones and watching television and video. I will initiate physical activities in my school in order to develop students' habits towards lifelong physical activity, to engage them in enjoyable physical activities, to support them in becoming physically fit, and to have general motor and behavioral skills.



- 6. To improve the school environment, I will focus on the waste management activity in my school. If the school environment is not clean, air, soil and water can be polluted and pets such as flies, mosquitoes and rats can easily breed. An unhealthy school environment can affect health because it can cause infectious diseases such as diarrhea and dengue fever. To provide students with a very clean and healthy environment, I will also educate parents about environmental waste management and persuade them to create a clean and healthy environment at home.
- 7. Including children with disabilities in regular schools is a challenge in Myanmar. Most children with disabilities do not have access to school and therefore they have less chance to become literate. I will ensure that inclusive education is implemented extensively in my school.



8. Disaster management activity is necessary and crucial for students. In Myanmar, storms and floods occur every year and sometimes earthquakes and fires also. Students need to have disaster management strategies such as a fire drill, evacuation drill and first aid in order to prevent and reduce the risks associated with disasters.

Overall, I will implement these school activities through a participatory approach involving all teachers, students, parents and health officers in the implementation and practical application of an effective school health program that takes a key role in students' lives. Eventually, I want to transform the school into a focal place that can transmit essential knowledge of health and how to have a healthy lifestyle to the whole community.

## Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

I am humbled and most honoured to be conferred the Princess Maha Chakri Award. It was a rare moment for me to meet with the Princess. Making new ASEAN friends during the trip was both a rewarding and enriching experience. All of us were given this privilege to learn from one another of our respective distinct and diverse cultures. I am grateful to be given the opportunity to meet many like-minded educators who share the same heartbeat for a quality and inclusive education. In addition, I was touched by the warm hospitality of the Thai people everywhere I went. Thailand truly lives up to its reputation of being "the land of a thousand smiles".

After receiving the PMCA 2015, I have carried out several activities.

#### 1. Educational Support for Low-Progress Learners

Our belief that every child matters lies at the heart of our education system. Singapore's education system is built on strong fundamentals. The focus on a student-centric, values-driven education underpins the belief that every child can learn regardless of background or ability. We are inclusive in our approach, providing opportunities for every child through various pathways.

This is something close to my heart because I teach pupils of varying abilities and from different backgrounds, including low-progress learners and special needs pupils in a mainstream school. I am committed to creating a safe and inclusive learning environment where they can thrive and experience success. Every classroom presents a unique community of learners. It is important to adapt and utilize different strategies to reach out to every pupil.







#### 2. Building an Inclusive School Culture

We value each child and adopt a whole-school approach in nurturing them. Recognising that collaboration is key to supporting our pupils with different learning needs, I have been leading an initiative known as "We Care". The We Care Team, comprising teachers with diverse skill sets, ensures that no pupil falls through the cracks, by providing the necessary classroom support and interventions for them to succeed.

To foster greater inclusivity, transition support sessions are conducted to induct teachers on the profile of our special needs pupils. Our teachers are also equipped with strategies to model caring and inclusive dispositions to nurture these pupils.

#### 3. Customised Programmes for Pupils with Special Needs

- The **VIP CLUB** was set up to provide a customised support programme through small group instruction to level up pupils with special needs. The club name is specially chosen to signify that the members are our "Very Important People". Through early intervention, we address their learning needs via differentiated instructional strategies and resources.
- The Play with Clay Programme is a clay moulding activity designed for our special needs pupils to enhance their motor skills, self-esteem and self-expression. Their parents participate in this multi-sensory hands-on experience so as to promote parent-child bonding. It was very heartening to see the parents encouraging their children, while co-creating the clay art with them and sharing their joy over the fruits of their labour.
- The Music Therapy for Learning Motivation Project explores music therapy as a tool to promote positive change in behaviour and motivate learning beyond the music classroom. The music activities are designed to improve pupils' self-esteem and to increase their motivation. With the help of a music therapist, this music intervention programme helps them develop better self-management skills and builds their confidence.

The Helping Individual Pupil Succeed' (HIPS) Resource Toolkit was
conceptualised and designed to enhance the understanding of teachers in
the area of special needs and empowers them with practical strategies to
support pupils who are diagnosed with special needs. This toolkit is used
at the VIP CLUB and in-class support sessions.

This project won the Innergy Commendation Award, which recognises innovative projects at the national level. The toolkit was also shared with the Allied Educators from other schools. Moving forward, we will partner parents and train them on the use of the resource toolkit. We are also exploring possible collaborations with professional agencies to refine and improve the content of the toolkit.

#### 4. A Holistic Approach to Education

It takes a village to raise a child. To build an inclusive education system, the tripartite effort from the school, home and community is required to nurture an individual. It is important to focus on the holistic development of the pupil and work with all relevant stakeholders to develop effective pupil intervention programmes.

While it is important to help pupils find academic success, it is even more critical to equip them with good values and a moral compass to help them navigate life's challenges. This year, I piloted the **HIPS STARS in Action** Programme for a whole-school approach to character education.

Anchored on our school's six core values (Sincerity, Charity, Graciousness, Integrity, Self-Discipline, Resilience), I led my team to design a set of behavioural indicators to sensitise the pupils to L.A.P – Live it, Act on it and Pass it on. We will also encourage parents to role-model and reinforce these values at home.

#### **Future Plans**

1. After receiving the PMCA, I had the privilege of attending the Learning Forward Conference in Canada in December 2016. The conference allowed me to gain valuable insights on leadership, as well as 21st century learning that is characterised by a thinking classroom. I hope to be able to apply the key principles learnt from this conference in my area of work and also share them with my colleagues.

- 2. Tapping the PMCA monetary award, I plan to set up a multi-sensory room in our upgraded school premise in 2019. The room will provide a safe and customised environment to stimulate all five senses to enhance pupils' learning. Research has shown that pupils with special needs learn better in a multi-sensory room by decreasing their anxiety, improving communication and enhancing interpersonal interactions. I am so excited by these prospects and am looking forward to the setting up of this room.
- 3. Following our success with the Music Therapy for Learning Motivation, we will embark on the Creative Play Therapy to reach out to a targeted group of pupils with social behavioural issues. During the play therapy sessions, each pupil will be guided by the trained therapist to use coping strategies in the face of challenges or difficulties. Research has shown that participants of play therapy are better able to express themselves in more constructive ways. Play therapy also builds their confidence, boosts their concentration, and develops greater resilience amongst the pupils.
- 4. Education provides opportunities for disadvantaged children to succeed and enhances their quality of life. I strongly believe that every child deserves access to quality education. This can be realised by leveraging the collective influence of the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization (SEAMEO). In the words of Dr Surin Pitsuwan during his keynote address (PMCA 2015) "We are the power of 10+1". I am grateful to be a part of this big family. My involvement does not stop here; I want to pay it forward and contribute further to education.

Moving forward, I will continue to champion inclusive education. HRH Princess Maha Chakri is an inspiration to us all - her outstanding achievements in the field of education development have improved the quality of life for many, including the disadvantaged. Following Her Royal Highness' lead, I want to be instrumental in living out the vision of Education for All, All for Education. Together, we can make the difference!

### Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

- 1. As the first recipient from Thailand of the prestigious Princess Maha Chakri Award (PMCA) 2015, many government bodies and individuals have recognized my achievements. This includes the Minister of Education, Thailand, Surat Thani Provincial Administration Officials, the Governor of Surat Thani Province, and the Director of Suratpittaya School. Furthermore, the Governor of Surat Thani Province and the Director of the Secondary Educational Service Area Office 11 acknowledged my persistent efforts in supervising the students' science projects which have won them world-class awards.
- 2. In addition to the PMCA, I have received several awards at the national level. To name a few, I was granted a Science Education Award from the Thailand Toray Science Foundation in 2016. A year later, I received a silver medal for the "One School, One Innovation" Award from the Teacher Council of Thailand on the Thai Teacher's Day 2017.
- 3. On the occasion of the Thai Teachers' Day on 16 January 2016, I was selected to lead the pledge of teachers at the Teacher Council of Thailand, Bangkok.

## Activities after Receiving PMCA 2015

After receiving the Princess Maha Chakri Award in 2015, my career path has moved from school principal to the deputy head of Lao Cai Education and Training Division, Lao Cai Province in February 2016. With this new position comes great responsibility and honour.

Shortly after receiving the award, I presented to the Ministry of Education and Training (MoET) of Vietnam highlighting the meaning and importance of this prestigious award, and participated in two forums organized by the MoET. I also shared with heads of the departments and principals nationwide on the content and value of this award, especially the content on educational initiatives acquired through the presentations of other PMCA awardees from other Southeast Asian countries. Moreover, I have been spreading the message to other units in order that they may emulate and strive to build the essential elements.

To promote the success of the Vietnam New School Model (VNEN), I have created many solutions to replicate the activities with specific actions as follows:

1. Continue to develop innovative ideas with new specific solutions to replicate the VNEN model to secondary and high school level. The implementation of the VNEN has been widespread within Lao Cai and throughout the country. More details information is as follows.

Currently, at primary level in Lao Cai, there were 81 voluntary extension schools applying the model in the academic year 2012/2013. The number has been increased to 165 schools over three years.

At secondary level in Lao Cai, there were four voluntary extension schools applying the model in the academic year 2012/2013. The number has been increased to 106 schools in the academic year 2016/2017.

At the country level, a total of 20 provinces voluntarily expanded this model with 987 schools reaching out to 133,562 students in the academic year 2016/2017. The model has been expanded to 54 provinces involving 2,245 schools and benefitting 450,445 students.

- 2. Teach teachers & staff regarding innovation, synchronization of teaching and learning methods, classroom organization, professional development, parent and community involvement, and educational materials design. Ifocus on the 21st century skills of students including teamwork skills, communication skills, leadership skills, and self-learning skills.
- 3. Establish an experienced teacher group who train others throughout the country.



- 4. I founded the Principal club to build school models and retrain good Principals:
  - Set up the self-management council and self-management club in the primary education model;
  - Provide consultancy on building the model associated with practicality and develop comprehensive education throughout each school in the club:
  - · Coordinate with other schools to organize impactful, novel activities;
  - Create fundamental change regarding the quality and the image of the school;
  - Ensure quality teaching based on the progress of students and their ability following personalization. Based on lesson content, teachers can divide their students into small groups as appropriate;
  - Support the expansion of school models throughout the whole country, such as school farm model, school tourism model, eco school model, school and real life model, school peach garden, and school-community connection model.



- 5. I design lessons which fits to individual students learning style in order to help them develop basic skills, life experience, personality development, careers orientation and special experiences based on the standard of knowledge. Learning materials given out should be flexible in accordance with the determined targets based on the level.
- 6. I have organized various educational activities, learning experiences and creative activities for students in primary school, such as games, role-plays, forums, contests, competitions, events, study visit, picnics, as well as club activities, campaign activities, and volunteer work.



7. With the money received from the fund, I have supported the students of two schools where I have successfully built the Vietnam New School (VNEN), \$1,000 each. The funding is for disadvantaged students including poor students, disadvantaged colleagues, and activities to promote the VNEN.

#### **Future Plans**

I look forward to gaining the assistance of the Kingdom of Thailand and other Southeast Asian countries, in order to develop Vietnamese schools towards standardization, modernization, socialization, democratization and national integration.
